AGENDA – AN ANTHOLOGY 1959-1993 Edited by William Cookson. This 420 page book attempts to gather the best material, both poetry and prose, that the magazine has published from its beginning.

Items of major importance are David Jones' long poem, 'The Sleeping Lord' which the poet completed for the first David Jones issue (1967), two uncollected drafts of Pound's *Cantos*, T.S. Eliot's 'Scylla and Charybdis', a lecture that first appeared in the T.S. Eliot issue (1985), Jean Cocteau's greatest poem, *Léone*, in a memorable translation by Alan Neame, a memoir of Yeats by Basil Bunting and a wide selection of the poems of Geoffrey Hill. There is also a memoir of Hill's schooldays which reprints his juvenilia from the Bromsgrove School literary magazine.

The Introduction provides a history of the magazine and outlines its aims. The range of poetry is varied and includes translations from Sappho, Catullus, Horace, Old English, Provençal, Dante, Villon, Hölderlin, Trakl, Mandelstam and Ungaretti.

The book is published jointly with Carcanet Press.
